Veterinarians are a unique national resource, as they are the only health professionals trained in multi-species comparative medicine. As a result of this training, the veterinary profession is able to provide an extraordinary link between agriculture and human medicine.

The combined 5-year Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and Master of Public Health program offered by Colorado State University and the Colorado School of Public Health will prepare you to identify and address the relationship between food production, disease control and the health of communities, both small and large. As an MPH/DVM student, you'll spend your first 12 months pursuing an MPH at the Colorado School of Public Health and, after successfully completing the MPH, you'll begin your first year of the DVM program. Up to 12 credits of approved coursework from the DVM program can be transferred into the MPH program.
